# St. Andrew's Endowment Committee Report

On Tuesday, February 4th, the Endowment Committee held their first quarterly meeting of 2025 which it used to get organized for the coming calendar year. Due to term expirations, this was the last meeting for Francine Klein, Committee Chair and Rob Stevens, Committee Treasurer. During the meeting, it was approved that their positions would be replaced by John Ferris Jr. and Margaret Neuman.

Marie Vanerian, Managing Director and Wealth Management Advisor from Merrill Lynch, called in and gave a historical update of the stock market performance as well as various 2025 stock market projections. Her graphs and documentation demonstrated that over the years, the Endowment Committee's portfolio has done very well and permitted us to fund numerous charitable initiatives over the years.

Maggie Raymer presented the minutes of the November 5th Quarterly Endowment Committee Meeting. She confirmed that the following funds were distributed by the committee during the 2024 calendar year:





#### 2025 to be a game changer

- The new shed has been electrified and we have lighting and plenty of plugs for any activities that will be held at the shed.
